World Book Day 2025 takes place on **Thursday 6 March** and we hope you'll join us as we come together for a week of celebrations in school.

On World Book Day - Thursday 6th March

Every year on World Book Day we are overwhelmed by the enthusiasm of our school community. We won't be wearing costumes this year, as this is an unnecessary additional expense for parents and it can take away from the real purpose of the day. Instead, we are having a bedtime story theme and hosting a **pyjama party!** We invite the children to come to school wearing their pyjamas and they can bring in their favourite book to show their friends if they wish.

We understand that it can be tricky, so if you have more than one child in school and cannot make different slots, just let us know and we can put them together. We are doing two Year groups at a time, so if you cannot make it for any reason, the children can still share a book, with the older ones reading to the younger ones.

Over half term, we are inviting you to get involved and help your child enjoy reading with some exciting competitions. There will be prizes for each class and overall, for the whole school.

Book in a box:

Children can make a mini scene in a box (a show box is perfect) from any story they choose, using items that have been recycled or reused. It could be any book at all, including one they have enjoyed in school. They can use their imaginations and be as creative as they like! Extreme Reading:

Extreme reading is all about reading in unconventional or surprising locations or situations. - in the garden shed
- at the top of a hill
- halfway up the stairs
- under a table
